YARD WASTE

Pam rode with Gail, our Allied trash truck driver, on Friday, April 1st to get an accurate count of the properties the town is getting trash billing for.

Now that we have confirmed the accurate count, we expect to get a price estimate from Allied to extend the contract we currently have with them. We are looking at possibly changing from once a week trash pickup and once a week recycle pickup to once a week trash and alternate weeks recycle and yard waste. Each property also has the option of purchasing a yard waste bin for the one time charge of \$60.00. The same bin will cost you \$95.00 if you purchase it retail. If residents choose not to purchase a bin, they must use biodegradable bags. Regular trash bags will not be acceptable.






I would like to take this opportunity to wish everyone a Happy Easter and to remind you all that with the weather getting warmer children will be out playing and riding their bicycles. Please make sure that any child under the age of 16 is wearing a helmet while they are riding their bicycle. Parents please don't forget to make sure you go over the rules of the road with your children. Remember bicyclists must obey all the motor vehicle laws and motorists must treat all bicycles like another vehicle. A bicycle must travel **with** the flow of traffic. When riding a bicycle at night the bike must be equipped with a headlight that is visible from 500 feet and a rear reflector visible for 600 feet and either reflective material or material visible on both sides for 600 feet or a lighted lamp visible from both sides for 500 feet. A taillight is highly recommended when riding at night. Below are the hand signals that a person who is riding a bicycle must use. Also make sure you go over the bicycle and make sure it is in good working order before your child rides it. I want to leave you with the quote for this month: "Those who expect moments of change to be comfortable and free of conflict have not learned their history."... Joan Wallach Scott.

At this time, there is no risk of exposure to radiation from Japan for people in Delaware. Therefore, the Delaware Division of Public Health is **advising against** taking KI (potassium iodide) at this time. DPH will continue to monitor the situation and advise if recommendations change.
