Yard Waste

Many of you have called Town Hall for information on the yard waste situation. We have been working with our trash contractor, Allied Waste, as well as the Town of Camden to come up with a plan that will work for everyone without costing too much money.

This is a new program for us all and no one really knows what is going to work for the most people. Camden has a tentative plan in place and Wyoming has decided it would be best to sit back and see how their plan works before we get involved in it.

In the meantime, we are recommending that anyone needing yard waste services call Delaware Solid Waste Authority (DSWA) at 1-800-404-7080 and ask to speak with Marcia. DSWA has a program in place temporarily that will deliver a tan yard waste bin to you at no cost. You will need to order tickets from them in batches of 10 at \$1.00 per ticket. When you need a pickup, notify DSWA, place 3 tickets in the envelope on the bin and place the bin out front. DWSA will be making pickups every other week.

When DSWA stops their program in September, you will be left with the bin. When Wyoming decides on a program for the town, you will already have a bin and will not need to purchase one.
