


WORD FROM WYOMING

Wyoming Police Department

I would like to take this opportunity to commend everyone for their behavior during the hurricane that took place on August 27 & 28, 2011. There was no incident that the Wyoming Police had to respond to during this time.

I would also like to remind everyone that school has started and that W. B. Simpson is now opened back up. The main entrance has changed. The buses will now be entering and exiting across from the Post Office. If you are dropping off or picking up, you need to go to the east entrance which is closest to Caesar Rodney High School. Remember the speed limit in front of W. B. Simpson is 20 mph Monday through Friday from 7:30 am to 3:30 pm when school is in session.

The state Department of Transportation sets the speed limits in Delaware. The speed limits are based on the design of the road and the type of vehicles that will use them. The speed limits take into account several things that you cannot see such as side roads and driveways that people could pull out of without warning, the amount of traffic that is on that road, and the amount of people that live in the area.

If you want to avoid a speeding ticket, here are a couple of helpful tips. If you are driving along and you see a speed limit sign that allows you to increase your speed, don't start to increase your speed until you reach that sign. If you are looking ahead and see a speed limit sign that is lower than the area that you are in, you need to start slowing down and be at that speed when you get to that sign. Remembering these tips will keep you from getting a speeding ticket.

I would like to leave you with this quote from Thomas Watson: "Nothing so conclusively proves a man's ability to lead others as what he does from day to day to lead himself."

Licenses and Interest

The Wyoming Town Council has just completed re-vamping the Landlord License, Business License and Outside Contractor License fees for the upcoming year. This is the reason the bills have been late going out.

Landlords are now being charged something for each rental unit they have as opposed to one set fee for a landlord regardless of whether they have one rental unit or ten.

We have also increased the outside contractor license fee; however, we will now be prorating the fee for those contractors applying later in the year.

Business license fees will be remaining the same.

Beginning in January 2012, finance charges of 3% will be added to any unpaid landlord or business license fee each month until paid.
