### Wyoming Police Department

I would like to take this opportunity to wish all mothers a HAPPY MOTHERS DAY. Don't forget, everyone should do something extra special for your mother on Mother's Day.

In the month of April the Wyoming Police Dept. has been busy with complaints. We have seen a rise in domestic type incidents this month.

Due to the fact that the Camden-Wyoming Little League started its season at the end of April, you will see an increase in the pedestrian and vehicle traffic in the evenings and during the day on Saturdays. When you are out and about please be mindful of the extra traffic.

There has been a lot of construction around town dealing in one way or another with the roads. While driving, make sure you pay attention to the flaggers that are in these areas, and reduce your speed. We have alerted one ready hand-vehicle accident which resulted in injuries. Here are some things to remember in a work (construction) zone. Observe what other drivers are doing and avoid sudden moves. Be patient and considerate to workers and other vehicles on the road. When approaching a work zone, reduce speed and start to brake gradually; this will allow vehicles behind you the chance to slow down prior to the work zone and be prepared to stop.
