REGULAR TOWN COUNCIL MEETING

CALL TO ORDER – Mayor Rife called the Meeting to order at 7:30 p.m.

ADOPTION OF AGENDA

- *Ms. Stokes made a motion to adopt the agenda as published. Mr. Witt seconded the motion. All in favor; none opposed.*

ADOPTION OF PREVIOUS MEETING MINUTES

- *Ms. Williams made a motion to approve all three of the previous month's minutes. Ms. Stokes seconded the motion. All in favor; none opposed.*

TREASURER'S REPORT

- *Ms. Williams presented the Treasurer's Report. Mr. Witt made a motion seconded by Ms. Stokes to accept the Treasurer's Report subject to audit. All in favor; none opposed.*
- *Ms. Williams also brought up the quotes on the door entry system – one is extremely higher than the other; we believe the higher one involves tying into the computer and the lower one is only an entry system. We need to be sure that if we go with the lower quote, we will have the information available to us that we need. Mr. Witt will contact him.*

POLICE REPORT – Chief Martin Willey

- Chief Willey gave the police report for May. The written report is part of the packet.
- Mayor Rife introduced the two young men who shared the Mike Brown Scholarship this year. Both of them were so closely qualified for the scholarship that the committee decided to give them each a \$250.00 scholarship rather than only one \$500.00 scholarship. The recipients are Benjamin R. (Trey) Mitchell III and Brendan W. Horne. They were both introduced to the council and public and presented with certificates and their checks.

FIRE COMPANY REPORT

- Mr. Fred Jester was present to give the report. During the month of May the EMT crews responded to 195 medical calls; fire & rescue responded to 36 alarms; medical assist to ambulance was 1; on-the-road time for apparatus was 15.5 hours; average number of volunteers per alarm was 11; average of 7 calls per day.
- CW Fire Company won best appearing Brush piece at the Smyrna Fire Company 125th anniversary parade. The Fire Company purchased this piece used from Smyrna Fire Company.
- Bingo still every Tuesday night at 7:00; doors open at 5:30.
- CW Fire Company is having a fund raiser through Texas Roadhouse on June 18th. 10% of your purchase will go directly to the fire company; must have a coupon available from the fire company.
- August 3 will be their crab feast. Tickets are \$30.00 in advance, \$35.00 at the door.

PARK/STREET REPORT

- Mr. Witt reported that the new brush for the street sweeper is in; however due to its size, Lew will need Mr. McNatt to help him put it on. The first phase of plantings at the park by DNREC is completed. Ms. Williams suggested that we might want to consider buying some more picnic tables for the park so that we would have more seating available. The pavilion is booking up quickly, often with double bookings on weekend days, and it would be nice to have more tables out in the park for people to use who can't book the pavilion. Mr. Witt agreed to get up with Sam's Club to see what kind of pricing they will give us for 10 tables.

- Peach Festival – Ms. Stokes reported that she has reserved 110 spaces so far, 14 are food vendors. There are 15 new crafters this year. The Del Dot application has been submitted and the letters have gone out to Norfolk Southern.

Ms. Williams made a motion seconded by Ms. Stokes to send the information on 5 N. Layton to our attorney to be sure we can legally move forward on this one. All in favor; none opposed.

Ms. Stokes made a motion seconded by Mr. Witt to appoint Hudson, Jones, Jaywork & Fisher as our attorney. Ms. Stokes, aye; Mr. Witt, aye; Ms. Williams, aye, Ms. Greenwood, nay. Motion passed.

Ms. Greenwood made a motion to adjourn the meeting. Mr. Stokes seconded the motion. All in favor; none opposed.
