That may seem like a long time away but it will be here before you know it. Elections will take place on Saturday, February 28, 2015 and anyone that is interested in running must turn in a written and signed letter of interest no later than Friday, January 30, 2015 at 4:30 p.m. In addition to your letter of intent, you will need to turn in the results of a criminal background check that you can have done at the Delaware Bureau of Investigations (DBI.) The results often take up to 4 weeks to receive if it is the first time you have had it done so please do not wait too long to go in for it. If you run, the Town will reimburse you for the cost of your background check.</p> <p>The two council seats that will be up for election have two year terms each. Those elected will be sworn in and take their seats at the May 2015 council meeting.</p>

<p>Recently we have had several residents calling in about light poles that are not working properly. The normal problems are that they do not light at all during the night or they stay lit all day and all night. Once in a while there is a pole that flashes on and off. When you report a light like this, please be sure to have an exact address that the pole is in front of or across the street from. We also need the 10 digit number that is on the pole. It is usually printed in two sets of 5 digits. This is the information that we need to give to Delmarva Power in order that they can find the correct pole and repair it. 

THANKSGIVING SAFETY TIPS



With Thanksgiving just a few weeks away. The Wyoming Police Department would like to share a few simple safety tips with you to keep you and your family safe for the holiday.

- ◊ Stay in the kitchen when you are cooking on the stovetop so you can keep an eye on the food.
- ◊ Stay in the home when cooking your turkey and check on it frequently.
- ◊ Keep children away from the stove. The stove will be hot and kids should stay 3 feet away.
- ◊ Make sure kids stay away from hot food and liquids. The steam or splash from vegetables, gravy or coffee could cause serious burns.
- ◊ Keep the floor clear so you don't trip over kids, toys, pocketbooks or bags.
- ◊ Keep knives out of the reach of children.
- ◊ Be sure electric cords from an electric knife, coffee maker, plate warmer or mixer are not dangling off the counter within easy reach of a child.
- ◊ Keep matches and utility lighters out of the reach of children — up high in a locked cabinet.
- ◊ Never leave children alone in room with a lit candle.
- ◊ Make sure your smoke alarms are working. Test them by pushing the test button.
