TOWN ELECTIONS


Are you ready for Town Council elections? They are coming up again. Wyoming will have two seats up for election or re-election this year; the seats currently being held by Terry Witt and Kyle Dixon. Both of these seats will be two year terms. If any of you are interested in running for a seat, you must get your letter of intent to run turned into the office no later than 4:30 p.m. on Friday, January 29, 2016 along with the results of a criminal background check. The election will be held on

Saturday, February 27, 2016.

To qualify for a seat on the Town Council of Wyoming you must be 21 years of age by the date of the election, a citizen of the State of Delaware, a qualified elector, and a bona fide domiciliary of the Town for at least one year prior to the date of the election.

With the election coming up, the Town needs resident volunteers to work at the poles and to be on the Board of Elections,

six people total. If you are interested in helping out for that, please drop off a short letter of interest to Town Hall as soon as possible to volunteer. These people will be appointed at the January Town Council Meeting.
