NOISE ORDINANCE

Beginning this month the Word from Wyoming will highlight one of the current Wyoming Ordinances. This month we are highlighting the noise ordinance.

As the warmer weather sets in more outdoor parties are planned, more dogs are left outside longer, and windows in cars get rolled down and radios gets turned up. This ordinance regulates ALL noise within the town limits of Wyoming.

Synopsis: This ordinance enacts a new ordinance titled, “An Ordinance Regulating Excess Noise in the Town of Wyoming.” This ordinance generally prohibits loud or unnecessary noises that are harmful to a reasonable person of normal sensitivities and specifically enumerates examples of prohibited noises. This ordinance provides expectations to noise regulations. Some exceptions of these exceptions include noises associated with emergency vehicles, religious chimes, parades, etc. Any individual violating this ordinance shall pay a fine of not less than \$25 and not more than \$50.
