Wyoming's Annual Halloween Fall Festival

On Saturday, October 31st from 6-8 p.m., the Town of Wyoming will hold its annual Halloween Fall Festival at the Train Platform, which is located next to the Town Hall/Police Department. As always, our volunteers will serve pizza, hot dogs, bottled water, and of course, CANDY!



We will also be participating in the Teal Pumpkin Project, which was created so that children with food allergies can still participate in the joys of trick-or-treating. Teal Pumpkin Project participants hand out non-food items, such as stickers, in place of candy. Participants are encouraged to place a teal painted pumpkin outside their home to indicate that they are participants in the program. As we did last year, this year the Town of Wyoming will once again have a "Teal Pumpkin Table" with goodie bags filled with non-food items for children with food allergies.

Fall Festival Road Closures

Trick-or-Treat Tips:

- Never, ever go into a stranger's house or even ring their door bell unless your parents are with you and say it's okay. There are some people in life that aren't very nice to kids and you must be careful. Always make sure that your mom, dad or guardian is with you when you go out trick-or-treating.
- Be careful when you cross a street. Make sure to look in both directions, and make sure that no cars are coming. If you have a little brother or sister with you, take their hand and help them cross the street, too. If the street has a stop light, wait until the cross walk light tells you that it's okay to cross, but still look both ways before you cross.
- If you're an older kid or young teen and are going out with friends, make sure your parents know where you are and who you're going with. This may seem like a pain, but they are your parents, they love you, and they want you to be safe.
- If you can drive and are taking a bunch of friends to a party, make sure you have enough gas to get there. You don't want to run out of gas on a dark street, all alone, like in a scary horror movie!
- Vandalism is never cool! Throwing eggs at cars and houses is destructive. You can be arrested and punished as a juvenile.
- Have fun on Halloween, but keep it safe.
- Parents: Check the candy and fruit your children collect. Throw away loosely wrapped or unwrapped candy. If you have concerns about any candy or fruit that your children have received, please contact the Wyoming Police Department and we'll examine it for you.
