Town Elections

Town elections will be in February. We have openings for two council people and the mayor's seat. Council seats run for two years; the mayor's seat is three years. If you are interested, please pick up an election packet at Town Hall. Qualifications are as follows: must be 21 years of age by the date of the election, must be a citizen of the State of Delaware, must be a qualified elector, and must be a bonafide domiciliary of the town for at least one year prior to the date of the election. Candidates must also supply the town with the results of a criminal background check at the time they file to

Maintenance Building





With this in mind, if you decide to take a vacation or visit family for the holidays, please stop by the Wyoming Police Dept. or Town Hall to fill out a property check form, and we will check your residence daily. This time of year is also when there are increases in thefts, burglaries and

robberies. Therefore, make sure you lock your vehicles and residences. Also when you go to the store in the evening, make sure you park in a lighted area. Remember to periodically check your neighbor's house/yard for anything suspicious. If you see something, call us and we'll investigate. Our dispatch number is 911 for emergencies and 302-739-7690 for non-emergencies.

It's been pretty quiet in town, which is good, with only a couple of accidents and minor thefts. During the holidays, we will increase our patrols to ensure that the residences are safe and to deter any type of criminal activity. If at any time you see something questionable, please feel free to contact me or any other police officer.
