# From Police Chief Willey

Spring is here, and the weather will improve which means there will be more foot traffic and more bicyclists. Be mindful of this when you're driving.

I want to remind you to make sure everyone in your vehicle is buckled up and that children under the age of eight and/or under 65 lbs. are in appropriate child restraints. If a child is under the age of eight years and/or 65 lbs. and they are using a seatbelt, a fine will be charged because the child is not in an approved child restraint seat. The fine for no seatbelt is \$93.50; and for no child restraint is \$104.50.

Delaware will have extra officers on the road in April to enforce the cell phone law. Remember: it must be hands-free. This also includes laptops, GPS, beepers, IPods, IPads, and any type of electronic device. The fine for the first offense is \$206, and each subsequent offense is higher.

March has been a fairly quiet month. We arrested a few people for domestics, and two people for stealing items out of cars. If your car is sitting in your driveway, make sure it's locked. The Wyoming Police Department has installed a metal mailbox (not for use by U.S. mail) next to the front door of the police department. Anyone who would like to contact us or leave a message for an officer can put it in the box. If you want to make us aware of an incident or something that's going to take place or has taken place and you want to remain anonymous, you can just drop it in the box and leave. This will enable us to be more available to the residents of Wyoming.

I'd like to leave you with this quote by Robert H. Schuller:
