Contractor Licenses & Bldg. Permits

A reminder to anyone doing any repairs, remodels or additions to your home or property: please be sure your contractor has a Contractor's License with the Town of Wyoming, not just the State of Delaware. The fee is \$100 per year, and the license year runs from October 1st through September 30th. Our town has an application that must be completed, and we require a copy of the contractor's State of Delaware license and a Certificate of Liability Insurance along with their payment in the form of check, money order, cash or credit card. There is a small convenience fee for credit card payments, which must be made at Town Hall. Just about every project requires a building permit. You, the owner, or the contractor may purchase the building permit, but it is ultimately the owner's responsibility that there is one. Permits are based on the cost of the project and the number of inspections required. We have an application that must be completed, and we need plot plans and drawings of what is being done, as well as a copy of a quote from your contractor stating the contract price. When in doubt, please call Town Hall at 302-697-2966 to inquire. We are now using First State Inspections as our building inspector; therefore, it's taking a little longer for permits to be approved and printed. Please give us several days to process your application and provide you with a permit. Thank you.

From Police Chief Willey

Summer is here and school is

out. The Wyoming Police Department sponsored the third annual Field Day at W.B. Simpson Elementary School. There were approximately 675 students who participated in the two day event. Everyone who participated had a great time. The police department supplied a pizza lunch for the students. We're looking forward to sponsoring it again next year.

The police department also participated in the nationwide Click It or Ticket It campaign in May. We received thanks from the Office of Highway Safety for our outstanding performance in this program. We averaged 3.38 arrests per hour. The officers did an outstanding job participating in this program.

Now that the weather is warm, I want to remind everyone that you'll be seeing an increase in motorcycles on the road. Please be mindful of them. During 2016, Delaware motorcycle deaths accounted for 11.8% of the fatalities. Delaware saw a 33.3% decrease in fatalities from 2016 to 2017.

Over the past couple of months, domestics continue to increase in Wyoming. Most of our criminal arrests are a result of domestics. Please remember that if you get into an argument, the best thing to do is to walk away, take a break, which will allow everyone to settle down, and then come back to discuss the issue. This is far better than getting into an altercation.

Remember: Delaware law requires the police officer to make an arrest in any domestic when one party has marks on them.

Another friendly reminder is that when you go on vacation, stop by Town Hall or the Wyoming Police Department and fill out a property check form. We will check your residence daily for you while you're on vacation.
