Assessments & Tax Bills

Wyoming tax bills are determined by Kent County's property assessment. In the beginning of May, Kent County will send Wyoming the assessment list which will be posted for your review. The list will be posted the beginning of June on the website (wyoming.delaware.gov), inside Town Hall, the Post Office, and at Hall's Family Restaurant. We ask that you review your assessed value for correctness. If you see a discrepancy in your assessment, please call the Kent County Assessment Office at 302-744-2386.

The actual tax bills from Wyoming will be mailed around July 1. They will be due no later than September 30, 2021; however, if paid in full by July 31, 2021, you will earn an early payment discount. If you do not feel you can pay your tax bill in full by September 30, please call Town Hall to set up a payment plan which can be weekly, bi-weekly or monthly.

Grass Clippings

The Town of Wyoming is very proud of its residents for keeping the town looking nice. Please remember that you must keep your grass under eight inches high. Also, please be sure to clean up the clippings on your sidewalks and street after you mow. The grass clippings can get into the sewer system and cause the storm drains to drain improperly.

<u>Pet Waste</u>

When walking your dog or other animal, it is your responsibility to clean up after them. It's not the most glamorous part of being an animal owner, but a necessary one. Ordinance #18-11 Section 8 violations are punishable by fines up to \$300.

Section 8. Animal Waste:

- (a) Soiling or damaging private property. No person having possession, custody, or control of any dog or other animal shall knowingly or negligently permit such dog or animal to damage, defile or defecate upon any private property within the town not owned or leased by such person.
- (b) Soiling or damaging public property. No person having possession, custody, or control of any dog or other animal shall knowingly or negligently permit such dog or animal to damage, defile or defecate upon any public property within the town, including but not limited to, gutters, driveways, streets, alleys, curbs, sidewalks, and parks or upon the floors or stairways of any building or place frequented by the public, or used in common by the tenants, or upon the outside walls abutting on a public street or park, or upon the grounds of any other public park or public area.
- (c) <u>Removal of feces</u>. Any person having possession, custody, or control of any dog or other animal which damages, defiles or defecates any area other than the private property of the owner of such dog or other animal, as prohibited herein, shall be required to immediately remove the said feces from the surface and dispose in a proper manner as follows: (a) in a toilet or (b) in a non-leaking container for deposit in a trash or litter receptacle.
