All yard waste, such as grass clippings, leaves, tree branches, twigs, brush, shrubs, bushes and weeds, must be placed **UNBAGGED** into the new Republic Services yard waste carts.

- **Do NOT bag yard waste** – Bags of yard waste will NOT be collected. Bags cannot be mulched.
- **All yard waste must be placed inside a cart.**
- **Do NOT overfill cart** – Lid should be closed. Overfilled carts cannot be collected.
- **Tree branches** – Tree branches must be 3 inches in diameter or smaller, must be cut to a length of 4 feet or less, and must be tied securely into bundles. Tree branches sticking out of a cart **CANNOT** be collected, as they are a safety hazard.
- **Restricted items** – Restricted items **CANNOT** be collected. These include mulch, dirt, pavers, railroad ties, fencing, concrete and rocks.



Carts must be placed 3 feet apart and at least 3 feet away from cars, trees, mailboxes, fences and gas/electric meters. The lid opening needs to face the street. Allow at least 16 feet of overhead clearance above the carts. Place carts as close to the curb or alley as possible.
