

Town of Wyoming Council Meeting Minutes March 10, 2025, 6:30 P.M.

REGULAR TOWN COUNCIL MEETING

CALL TO ORDER –Mayor Denison called the meeting to order at 6:30p.m.

PUBLIC COMMENTS

- Ms. Sweeney advised that she had asked about child signs for S. Layton Ave. She has not seen them put up yet. Staff will look into it.
- Mr. Wooleyhand believes we are waiting for the signs.
- Mrs. Bilow stated that the line at the end of Pine Street at the stop sign does not go all the way across. She indicated if it went all the way across that would possibly stop the wrong way drivers.
- Mr. Winchell stated that the January meeting had an item added and it was voted
 on. He says that this cannot be done. Mr. Winchell also expressed his concerns
 that the CWSWA board members were not contacted about this agenda item. He

- advised that Mr. Quinn has resigned and himself and the other board member will be stepping down.
- Mr. Gibbs thanked Mr. Wooleyhand and Mr. Dixon for coming over during the storm to see what they were dealing with, in regard to the water flooding their home. He expressed that it needs to be a priority to have this situation resolved quickly.

POLICE REPORT

- Chief Baker presented February's police report to the council.
- There were 110 traffic tickets, 155 town ordinance tickets, 46 warnings, 2 criminal arrests, 7 accidents, and 250 total complaints handled by the WPD.
- Speed trailer's firmware has been updated, Trailer will be placed this week.
- Chief Baker presented Sgt. Wiley the 2024 Officer of the Year award for his hard work and dedication to the Town of Wyoming.
- Chief Baker also presented a Chief Citation to Mrs. Lindale.

FIRE COMPANY REPORT

• Mr. Piazza presented February's report for the fire company.

- Egg Hunt has been scheduled for Sunday April 13th due to Rider Pride Day being on Saturday.

NEW BUSINESS

o Rotary Club 80th Anniversary

- o Mrs. Lindale read Proclamation.
- Mr. Denison presented Proclamation to Annie Mathisen and Ronald Kahn.

Mrs. Wooleyhand moved with a second by Ms. Johovic to sponsor a team for \$425. Mayor Denison, Ms. Johovic, Mr. Dixon, Mrs. Wooleyhand and Ms. George, Aye. None Opposed. Motion carried.

Stormwater Repairs on Medallion Circle

o Mr. Wooleyhand explained that the town had contracted Roto-Roter to camera and jet the storm drain at the end of Medallion.

- o Roto-Roter's camera had been sent for a recall and was not back yet.
- Mr. Wooleyhand spoke to Miller Environmental Group, and they were able to come same day to jet the drain.
- o Miller was able to jet about 86ft of the pipe. Hand probed when they could no longer jet and found that the pipe had collapsed.
- It was recommended to replace whole pipe as it was only a matter of time before the other section would collapse.
- Mr. Wooleyhand was able to secure \$15,000 from Senator Paradee and \$10,000 from Representative Yearick for the project.

Ms. Johovic moved with a second by Mr. Dixon to contract Miller's for the drain repair. Mayor Denison, Ms. Johovic, Mr. Dixon, Mrs. Wooleyhand and Ms. George, Aye. None Opposed. Motion carried.

UNFINISHED BUSINESS

Access Control

- o Mr. Wooleyhand explained that B-safe does not include the doors needed.
- Advantech is a one stop shop supplying doors, electronic hardware and access control system.
- Mr. Wooleyhand acquired door quotes, but town would still have to pay for the installation of the door hardware.
- Chief Baker advised this was the same company that the town is contracting for the cameras and would like to keep it all with same company.
- o Mr. Kelly and Mr. Johnson from Advantech were present to address questions from council.
- Discussion ensued regarding fund allocation for project. This project is covered by the Bond Bill funds.

Mr. Dixon moved with a second by Ms. Johovic to contract Advantech for access control. Mayor Denison, Ms. Johovic, Mr. Dixon, Mrs. Wooleyhand and Ms. George, Aye. None Opposed. Motion carried.
