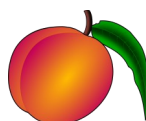
## Question of the month

**TOWN ORDINANCE SECTION 8: ANIMAL WASTE**

It is unlawful to allow your dog to defecate on public or private property owned by others. You must immediately remove and properly dispose of your dog's waste.

**EXCEPTIONS:** This ordinance does not apply to guide dogs assisting a blind person or dogs assisting other physically challenged individuals.
